Dr. Richard E. Bauer, DMD, MD

Dr. Richard E. Bauer, DMD, MD is a board certified oral and maxillofacial surgeon. He is a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh Schools of Dental Medicine and Medicine and completed his residency training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center. He has served on multiple committees for the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Bauer was a full-time faculty member and Residency Program Director at the University of Pittsburgh. He has

established a private practice and is focused on dental implant therapy and corrective jaw surgery. He maintains clinical appointments in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery and Otolaryngology. Dr. Bauer has been active in research with focuses on hard and soft tissue regeneration and computer assisted surgery. He continues to collaborate locally, nationally and internationally on advancing the field of oral and facial regeneration and reconstruction. His practice is a member of the McGuire Institute, a practice-based clinical research network.

Jay P. Malmquist, DMD, FACD, FICD, FAO

Dr. Malmquist is an Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeon with a private practice in Portland, Oregon. He is a graduate of the University of Oregon and the University of Oregon Dental School. He completed an internship in the US Army and a residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Oregon Health Sciences University. He is a diplomat of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and completed seven years as an ABOMS board examiner. He is the past Treasurer and past President of the American

Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons. He is also the past President of the Academy of Osseointegration completing his tenure in 2020. He has authored numerous chapters in books on implant surgery and has written multiple articles on bone grafting and tissue regeneration. He has lectured nationally and internationally on topics of implant placement and bone grafting giving more than 250 lectures on the international stage. He is currently a Past Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Oral Pathology at Oregon Health Sciences University. He is a reviewer of the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, the Journal of Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry and the International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Implants. Dr. Malmquist is currently the Chairman of FOR; a Nobel Biocare Foundation and is the Initial and Past Chairman of the Osteoscience Foundation and currently a sitting Board member. He maintains a private practice in Portland, Oregon with his son Dr. Michael Malmquist.

RAY REID LECTURESHIP SPEAKER



Brett P. Giroir, M.D.

Dr. Brett Giroir is a physician-scientist whose career has been dedicated to improving public health. Formerly, he served as the 16th Assistant Secretary for Health in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Acting FDA Commissioner, and Admiral in the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps. He also served as the US Representative to the Executive Board of the World Health Organization within the Department of State. Notably, Dr. Giroir was on the front lines of

the COVID-19 response as a member of the White House Coronavirus Task Force and the national lead for testing and diagnostics ("Testing Czar").

Previously, Dr. Giroir has served in numerous leadership positions in the federal government and in academia. He was the first physician to serve as an office director at the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA) and led the Blue-Ribbon Panel for the Veterans Choice Act Reform of the VA Health System. His academic career included service as Professor and Executive Vice President and CEO of the Texas A&M Health Science Center, Vice Chancellor for the Texas A&M University System, and before that, tenured professor and holder of two endowed chairs at UT Southwestern Medical Center and Children's Health in Dallas.

Dr. Giroir currently serves as CEO and a member of the Board of Directors for Altesa BioSciences, Inc., a clinical stage biopharmaceutical company focusing on developing new treatments for respiratory viruses and global viral threats. His non-profit activities include Board service on the Global Virus Network and Remote Area Medical (RAM), and he remains active in humanitarian initiatives in Latin America and Sub-Saharan Africa.

Dr. Giroir has received numerous awards including the American Society of Nephrology Presidential Medal; the American Society of Hematology Outstanding Public Service Award; the Sickle Cell Community Consortium Healthcare Champion Award; the Society of Federal Healthcare Professionals, Tip of the Spear Federal Healthcare Leadership Award; the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists Pharmacy Champion Award; and the Secretary of HHS (Becerra) Award for Distinguished Service.

His uniformed service decorations include the US Public Health Service Distinguished Service Medal with Gold Star Attachment, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Surgeon General's Medallion, the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response Pinnacle Medal, the Global Health Campaign Medal, Presidential Unit Citation, and the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service, among other awards.

Vishy Broumand, DMD, MD

Vishy Broumand, DMD, MD is a graduate of the University of Florida College of Dentistry and the University of Miami School of Medicine. He completed his six-year residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery along with an additional PGY-2 year of General Surgery and an advanced one-year fellowship in Head and Neck Tumor and Reconstructive Surgery under the mentorship of Dr Robert E. Marx.

Upon completion of fellowship, he was in private practice from 2006 to 2012, and later served as Assistant Professor of Surgery in the University of Miami School of Medicine Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from 2012 to 2015.

He now permanently resides in Scottsdale and has a full-time private practice of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Desert Ridge Oral Surgery Institute. He also serves as Section Chief and Associate Professor of Oral Surgery at the University of Arizona, Banner University Medical Center where he trains Oral Surgery residents in the full scope of Oral Surgery. He is the official team oral surgeon for the MLB Arizona Diamondbacks and the NBA Phoenix Suns.

He devotes most of his clinical practice to the comprehensive treatment of patients with missing teeth using conventional and zygomatic dental implants with the latest digital technology. In 2019 he founded an advanced dental implant training center "Total Dental Implant Solutions" in Phoenix, AZ. and has trained close to 200 oral surgeons during live surgery courses in the USA on zygomatic and pterygoid Dental Implants and the digital restorative workflow. He developed a specialized Zygomatic Notch Retractor and has authored numerous book chapters and articles in peer reviewed publications on Zygomatic and Pterygoid implants as well as various bone grafting techniques in s reconstruction of the maxillofacial regions.

He regularly participates in medical rescue missions and relief efforts through several non-profit foundations such as "Mission Rescate" and "Operation Changing Lives" and has served on the Board of "Orphans Worldwide", another non-profit foundation since 2010.


